Introduction to Cody Dock:

Gasworks Dock Partnership (**GDP**), a registered charity based in the East London Borough of Newham, is leading the regeneration and development of Cody Dock into a Creative Industries and Community Quarter. With the local ecology and heritage at the heart of our work, Cody Dock is rapidly becoming a beacon of learning and community led environmental action at the heart of its community. This project stands on the shoulders of these recent achievements and will establish Cody Dock as a local and internationally renowned environmental hub and centre of excellence for environmental education, community-led climate change & urban biodiversity research. This new environmental programme has been co-designed and shaped by the needs of local residents and

their wish to be included in the transformation of their local area. With new facilities and improved accessibility, it is a fantastic time to help grow our already extensive programme of activities and increase participation in conservation work, climate change, environmental and heritage education.

Main Purpose:

The Urban Ecology programme aims to engage local people with the nature spaces on their doorstep and explore the ecology of this otherwise unexplored region of the city, on the River Lea. The Education Assistant will be working with the Education Manager as part of the Environment and Ecology team to deliver a range of ecological, heritage and climate-based educational activities to children and young people from the local area. They will be partnering with local schools, youth groups and community groups to champion urban environmental and local river based heritage education. Specific tasks and responsibilities are listed in the table below.

Key Tasks and Responsibilities

General

- Participate in relevant training and development to improve skills and knowledge
- Work with project managers and event coordinators to deliver live education workshops at community events
- Work with the Education Manager to effectively communicate ecological and climate issues and engage young people with urban nature conservation
- Assist the Education Manager in delivering the Engagement Volunteering Programme, including recruitment, processing and training.

Outreach

- Support Biodiversity Manager and Education Manager, brokering and maintaining relationships with stakeholders such as universities, businesses and other charities, linking these relationships with appropriate education faculties
- Form new and grow existing partnerships with schools and youth zones
- Lead sessions/workshops in schools and community hubs

Delivery

- Assist Education Manager in delivering schools' education sessions onsite
- Deliver a range of ecological and climate based education activities and projects, including monitoring and evaluation
- Assist in the delivery of educational events, fairs and clubs
- Develop a range of activities and resources for visits, field trips and field studies
- Create online educational resources such as educational videos for our youtube and social media channels

Development

- Work with and support volunteers with a range of interests and skills
- Work with the wider team to expand GDP's reach and develop more inclusive activities that improve the project's capacity for SEND and its overall EDI
